
Other warnings



Hazardous materials shall be kept locked when not in use.




Store toxic substances below or separate from food.



Unlocking devices shall be kept out of reach. Keys shall be kept out of locks.



Storage at or above 5 feet in a cabinet or shelf above the finished floor is considered out of reach of children.



Products labeled "Keep Out of Reach of Children" without any other warning shall be kept inaccessible to children when not in use. These are not required to be kept locked.



Designated emergency medicine does not have to be locked but stored out of the reach of children.
