WIC (Women, Infants, and Children)/ Nutrition Services

WIC provides nutrition education and special foods to pregnant or breastfeeding women, infants, and children up to five years who meet certain income limits and needs.

Individual services include nutrition assessment and counseling by a Nutritionist for residents who have a physician's referral. Group services include scheduled nutrition classes for residents with similar health interests and needs.

Animal Control/Animal Shelter

The Animal Control program is available to control the spread of diseases, animal pick up, and dog/cat adoption. The shelter is open onday-Friday, 9:00 a.m.– 4:00 p.m. 1370 County Land Rd, Randleman (county landfill).

Care Coordination for Children Program

This program serves children from birth to five years who have special health care needs, premature infants, foster care children and children exposed to “toxic stress” (domestic violence, active parental substance abuse, etc).

Communicable Diseases (HIV, STD, TB)

This clinic provides screening and treatment for communicable diseases including HIV, STDs, and Tuberculosis (TB). Pregnancy tests are offered for a fee of \$21. The clinic offers childhood and adult shots for those who qualify. The clinic is open Monday-Friday on an appointment schedule.

Dental Health Program

This program provides clinical treatment for children ages one through high school for qualifying families. Adults that meet the income requirements may receive limited treatment for dental emergencies only. Community education and prevention programs are available upon request.

Environmental Health Services

To keep the environment and residents healthy, Environmental Health performs soil and land evaluations for permitting septic tanks, permits new well construction, performs well water testing, conducts rabies investigations, and inspects many facilities, including restaurants, motels, and Mobile home parks.

Family Planning Clinic

Helping men and women plan their families. We offer birth control, counseling, education, and physical exams for women of child-bearing age. Services are provided on a sliding scale fee system based on income and family size.

Health Education

This program helps the community prevent unnecessary illness and improve their quality of life. Through Health Education, one learns to avoid risky behaviors and make healthier choices. This is accomplished through group and individual classes, health fairs, educational resources and implementing policy changes.

Public Health Preparedness

This program plans for response to disease outbreaks or public health disasters. Presentations are available upon request.

Pregnancy Care Management Program

Clients will receive managed care services with the goal of improving birth outcomes and quality of maternity care. Referrals for pregnant women may come from any community program, OB-GYN, WIC, Pregnancy Care Center, DSS, etc.
