RANDOLPH COUNTY EMPLOYEES PARTICIPATE IN MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TRAINING

Randolph County Veteran Services and Veteran Bridge Homes hosted our Mental Health First Aid class on November 22. Mental Health First Aid is an evidence-based, early-intervention course that teaches participants about mental health and substance use challenges. It gives participants the tools to handle emergency situations and how to properly get someone in crisis to a trained professional while de-escalating the situation. Randolph County Veteran Services are currently working on our 2025 schedule to host 4 more classes in the upcoming year.
